
# CHANGING LIVES THROUGH MOBILITY Costa Rica Wheelchair Distribution Trip

On January 18-27, 2023, 11 team members from Hope Haven went on a wheelchair distribution trip to Costa Rica. Many lives were changed, including our own Hope Haven employees! 80 individuals received wheelchairs that were measured and fitted personally for each person. Many of these individuals were receiving their wheelchair for the first time.

One of the members, Amber Altena, Community Living Supervisor at Hope Haven for 17 years, went on her first trip. "I work as a community living supervisor for Hope Haven. In Costa Rica, I worked as a storytelling translator.



As individuals received their chairs, I would hear their stories, and worked with a translator to document their difficulties before the chair, and to learn how a chair will benefit their life."



working in several stations, assisting recipients with fitting their new chairs. "We measure individuals for a chair; then we measure again to ensure it is just right. We lined the chairs up in boxes according to size, and I worked with the person who did the fitting, adjusting, pulling the chairs from the boxes, and fine-tuning them for the person who would receive it. It was a lot of back and foot adjustments to work to customize the fit for each person," Feikema said.

Feikema remarked on the number of dedicated volunteers in Costa Rica that worked with the team. "There were four local men who volunteered with us. On the last day, I remember a man named Louis. He worked for four straight hours working on one chair. He took the entire chair apart and rebuilt it to fit perfectly for that individual."

Altena shared an intense personal connection she made on the trip. "There was a boy named Sebastian I met who was dropped as a newborn baby. He was autistic, non-verbal, and suffered from seizures. So often, I asked myself, am I supposed to be on this trip? How will God use me? And it was at this moment I was here for a reason. My daughter is also non-verbal and struggles with similar things; I was exactly where I was supposed to be."

The emotional reactions many recipients have to receiving a chair is overwhelming. Altena shared, "There was another lady named Maria, a fisher woman, and breadwinner of her home, supporting her daughter

and granddaughter. She was out in her boat and was hit by another, and the boat snapped her leg off. She was in severe pain. When she was finally fitted for a chair, she wept the minute she hit the seat."

Something Feikema noted about how Hope Haven handles distribution is their model of "treating everyone as they are the number one person. People come in with a stricken look on their faces and often leave clapping, smiling; it is truly life-changing." Feikema could travel and work at several stations at the distribution center, experiencing everything Hope Haven provides. "There was a station where the recipient took pictures with family members and a spiritual station where we prayed and talked about special concerns. There was also a station that talked about medical care and how to care for yourself and also how to care for the chair." The team also went into some private homes for recipients that could not get to the distribution.

"I walked away from this experience, realizing how fortunate we are that we were born here. These people had nothing, but they were clean, well-presented, happy, whole families all living together. Some of these people care for someone 24/7, there is no daycare or home health, but they care for one another," Feikema said.

"I would gladly go again," Feikema added. "Whether or not they should do something like this, God has a reason for going. He uses people so well. He brought us to where our natural talents were. God has people in mind; you just have to say yes."

## DOUBLE HH MANUFACTURING EXPANSION

Double HH Manufacturing, a division of Hope Haven, is a couple of months away from completing a 35,000-square-foot addition to expand the use of robotics, cobots, and state-of-the-art order picking/packing operations.

Established in 1970, Double HH Manufacturing evolved from a work training facility in Hope Haven's main building in Rock Valley to employ people with disabilities, to the business it conducts today. About the same time, a local business gave the work training facility a couple of machines and a basic hitch pin design. The hitch pin was initially sold to local farmers, who offered suggestions regarding the product's design. Today, the hitch pin design has become one of the most widely imitated worldwide!

"We recognized opportunities to expand not only in the hitch pin production but also in the other machining services Double HH could offer to customers"

said Loy Van't Hul, Double HH's Chief Manufacturing Officer. "The move increased manufacturing

and warehouse space, and we wanted to take advantage of those opportunities." Along with the hitch pin, Double HH Manufacturing has expanded its product line to include other types of pins, non-threaded fasteners, and tractor 3-point linkage parts.

The company has remained under the direction of Hope Haven, and an integral part of its mission. Its employee base consists of people with disabilities and people without disabilities. Today, the company employs 60 people.

### WINTER WONDERLAND PROM




Individuals ages 14 and up were invited to dress their best and enjoy a meal, grand march, and dance.


