STATE OF IOWA GRANT Growing Opportunities


- Construction of (3) new zero-entry handicap accessible homes
- Purchase of (7) handicap accessible wheelchair vans
- Purchase & implementation of new Electronic Health Record software

ZERO-ENTRY HANDICAP ACCESSIBLE HOMES

Hope Haven has recently been awarded a grant from the State of Iowa. The funds from this grant are being put towards the three projects listed above. These three projects will allow Hope Haven to provide the best quality care possible, and growing opportunities for clients to be involved in their communities.

Hope Haven provides home and community based services (HCBS) to individuals in 49 residential sites in 14 different communities. A majority of these homes are multi-level, with multiple steps and cumbersome floor layouts that make mobility a challenge. The opportunity to build zeroentry homes will allow Hope Haven to provide services to individuals with disabilities as they age so they may remain living in their community.

This grant will allow for the construction of 3 new zero-entry handicap accessible homes that will be built in Iowa - Spencer, Estherville, and Sioux Center. Not only will the funds enhance the HCBS services provided, it will also increase Hope Haven's capacity to serve individuals in their communities as they age. These homes will have an open floor plan, zero entrance, extra wide hallways, large bedrooms, and accommodate mechanical lifts. These features will allow clients to live more independently, living a full, and meaningful life.



HANDICAP ACCESSIBLE WHEELCHAIR VANS

As stated, many of the individuals Hope Haven provides services to have been with the agency for many years, resulting in a higher aging population with growing limitations of mobility. Therefore, the availability of a wheelchair accessible van will be essential to allow clients to be active in their communities.

CONTINUED - STATE OF IOWA GRANT



Hope Haven has purchased seven new wheelchair accessible vans that will be utilized for two programs. First, daily HCBS residential services will use the vans to transport clients to day services such as volunteering in the community. Secondly, the My Day program will utilize the transportation to engage in purposeful activities, such as job tours, health and wellness programs, and visiting community resources such as the library, art studios, and museums.

With a growing attendance in these programs, the new wheelchair accessible vans will provide opportunities for each client to attend.

ELECTRONIC HEALTH RECORD SOFTWARE

Lastly, Hope Haven will be implementing a new Electronic Health Record (E.H.R.) software. E.H.R. is where Hope Haven records and stores data consisting of personal information, authorizations, service planning, event records, and billing information. Currently, Hope Haven has 400+ staff utilizing the software on a daily basis to support their clients. This technology allows for effectiveness and efficiency in carrying out the services Hope Haven provides.

Hope Haven has used the same E.H.R. system since 2016 and will now be moving on to a new E.H.R. software called SETWorks. The decision on which E.H.R. to switch to was largely made due to SETWorks priority on being a Residential, Day and Employment software - which are core services Hope Haven provides. The implementation of the new software will provide a more reliable and trustworthy data base for client's information, allowing for ease of work for staff and a more secure system overall.

HHIM VOLUNTEER RECOGNITION

In 2022, HHIM:

- Manufactured & refurbished 1,573 wheelchairs
- Shipped 4,545 wheelchairs to 21 countries
- Totaled 13,478 volunteer hours
- Totaled 19,846 community service hours

Hope Haven in Spirit Lake, IA has purchased a new building downtown to be utilized for their My Day Services. This new space will open up many possibilities for the My Day Program. Just a few of the benefits this building will provide is lessening the waitlist time for clients wanting to get into the program and providing a chance for more individuals to attend at one time. This allows for growth within the program which Hope Haven has already seen with multiple clients showing interest in attending My Day to enhance their personal and social skills.

The Hope Haven staff and clients in Spirit Lake are specifically looking forward to a kitchen set-up in this space, multiple sensory areas, and different rooms to break out into smaller groups. Staff will be able to work alongside My Day members teaching them cooking skills, supporting them in their sensory needs, and watching them build new

friendships. Having designated spaces to learn these skills is a huge benefit for the individuals involved in My Day. Not only does it give structure to the skills being taught, but also provides a fully equipped area for clients to learn in.

The opportunities are endless in this new space that Hope Haven has been blessed to purchase. The My Day program continues to grow, and this is a great step forward in growing availability to as many clients as possible.
