WINTER HORIZONS 2024

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Hope Haven partnered with Parlay Consulting Firm in creating an innovative and actionable three-year strategic plan. The team met virtually for multiple sessions. The sessions included acknowledgment of organizational history and successes, discussion of the current reality (i.e., strengths and weaknesses), development of a three-year practical vision, group consensus-building on the strategic directions, developing three-year goal strategies, setting annual goals, and a one-year implementation plan.

ADVANCE TECHNOLOGY

One of the strategic directions to boost service impact is to advance technology. The team researched companies specializing in technology options and services to improve independence living for people with disabilities or those who prefer to age in place.

Currently, Hope Haven has six homes that use remote technology supports during the overnight hours. Nine homes use panic buttons to assure staff feel safe and supported while working in the homes and in the community. We continue to utilize med dispensers for some individuals that need reminders to take their medications. We also have ring doorbell products, heat sensors/stove sensors, seizure sensors, along with window and door alarms to ensure safety.

Hope Haven recently bought three lots in Spencer, Sioux Center, and Estherville to replace the older, non-accessible homes. We are also remodeling a home in Hull. The goal is to make these homes smart homes, so we're collecting information from the residents about the technology that would be beneficial for them.

The homes will be accessible, ranch-style homes to better support people living there along with allowing people to remain in their homes and age in place as long as they can.

In order to meet a person's health, safety, and other needs, the State of Iowa is also implementing remote support as a service delivery option through Home Based Habilitation and Supported Community Living. This is only the case if the person's support plan identifies remote support as a preferred method of service delivery that meets their needs. These supports will provide a realistic, non-invasive way for people to build skills and familiarity in the level of independence with a sense of security.



THREE-YEAR STRATEGIC PLAN (CONTINUED)

"We are thrilled about the potential this opportunity holds for the people we serve at Hope Haven! With enabling technology, people can feel more safe and at ease at home," says LeAnn Blau, Director of Community Living Services. Hope Haven partnered with Awake Labs in a 2-year pilot project beginning of November 2023. We will have ten people using the wearables that monitor their stress levels through various vital signs. This information is delivered to another device monitored by staff so they are aware of the heightened emotions. Staff are able to connect with the person served and can help them be self-aware and utilize personal coping strategies. We will also have access to a dashboard, so we can track trends and implement changes based on these trends. The goal is to raise their self-awareness, reduce behaviors, and improve quality of life.

Hope Haven is partnering with Technology First Shift in early 2024, enabling five Hope Haven staff to access the curriculum and be certified as technology integration specialists. There are many exciting opportunities on the horizon for individuals receiving support from Hope Haven that will empower independence, support self-determination, and enhance their quality of life.

NEW MEANS OF COMMUNICATION

Another strategic direction to boost service impact is a new means of communication with staff and those we serve at Hope Haven. This strategy plan is to create and implement an engaging feedback process to give voice and choice to those we support. A team worked together to find the right tool that would bring the individuals hopes, dreams, and aspirations alive. A template called "My Personal Centered Plan" was discovered by the team to utilize graphics, personal pictures, and concise language to give voice to those that have difficulty communicating their needs.

The 22-page document list detailed questions about their likes/ dislikes, important people, favorite activities, health, values, community, safety, proud moments, future dreams, and goals. Family, friends, caregiver, or supporters fill out the document with the most accurate information about their loved ones. Each person has a copy of the document on file so staff can learn more about them, their background, and their interests in order to foster positive relationship.

WELLNESS RECOVERY ACTION PLAN (WRAP)

Hope Haven received grant money from Care Connections of Northern Iowa Region to invest in more mental health training for staff and people served. This enabled Hope Haven to send staff to a week-long Wellness Recovery Action Plan (WRAP) facilitator training.

WRAP is an evidence based personalized wellness and mental health recovery approach that was developed in 1997 by people who had been living with a variety of mental health challenges and who were working hard to feel better and get on with their lives. WRAP focuses on five key concepts to recovery - Hope, Personal Responsibility, Education, Self-Advocacy, and Support. WRAP helps people to: 1) decrease and prevent intrusive or troubling feelings and behaviors; 2) increase personal empowerment; 3) improve quality of life; and 4) achieve their own life goals and dreams.

The concepts and objectives of WRAP align well with Hope Haven's Intensive Psychiatric Rehabilitation (IPR) program. IPR is an evidence-based recovery focused program that helps participants make systematic changes in their lives through individual and group sessions.

We partnered with these two programs and began offering WRAP during IPR groups. In June, we started a four week-long WRAP group with our LeMars IPR group. We had eight participants in the group. We received positive feedback from the participants of the group. In December, we started another WRAP group with our Sheldon IPR participants. Our goal is to continue to offer WRAP groups in communities where we are providing IPR services, as well as Home Based Habilitation services and peer support services.
